

This weekend Carol and I will drive over to my old hometown of Franklinton, Louisiana, for my High School Reunion. On the way, we'll stop to visit the Campbells in Baton Rouge. Frank and Cheryl were our closest friends during our years there, and we dearly miss spending "friend time" with them. Emails and telephone calls help, but nothing takes the place of face-to-face. We need a day and night together to break bread, laugh, tell stories, look into each other's eyes and just be with one another.

Summer ought to offer this special opportunity to reconnect with special people. Add a few miles to the family vacation and you can revisit a city where you once lived or the current home of a family dear to you. Squeeze just a few days away and you can take a direct journey to see friends too long absent. Friendship is different from all other relationships. Unlike acquaintanceship, it is based on love—it is free of jealousy, it knows neither criticism nor resentment. Friendship has no status in law. Business partnerships are based on a contract. So is a marriage. Parents are bound by the law, as are children. But friendship is freely entered into, freely given, freely exercised.

Friends never cheat each other, or take advantage, or lie. Friends do not spy on one another, yet they have no secrets. Friends glory in each other's successes and are downcast by the failures. Friends minister to each other, nurse each other. Friends give to each other, worry about each other, stand ready to help. Perfect friendship is rarely achieved, but at its height is an ecstasy.

True friends make a difference in the world and in us. They are among the most precious and critical relationships one can have in life, and you cannot have too many. So this summer, if you get to visit special friends, remember what a blessing it is. And, if you are just planning your travel, be sure to ask who lives in the area that you know and include an excursion to see them. Or take a direct quick trip! You will be glad you did.

Meanwhile, here in Houston, why not make a special effort to spend part of these long days with the special people closer by? Life has a way of getting in the way of enjoying the friend just a few blocks away as much as those separated from us by thousands of miles. Don't allow it to happen. Pick up the phone, surprise them with a visit, meet them for dinner or send an email, if that's the best you can do. Summer's the time for catching up on relationships that, without tending, cannot grow or even live. Enjoy a friend today, and I'll look forward to enjoying you again in church soon.


